Rhode Island Distributed Generation Updates



DG Standard Contracts Program thru 2014

- As of December 31, 2014, 22,063 kW of renewable energy capacity was installed through this program (commencing in 2010).
- The 40 MW Distributed Generation Standard Contracts
 Program ended in December 2014, essentially replaced
 with a tariff-based the Renewable Energy Growth
 (REG) Program.
- The DGSC and associated MW capacity will be constructed and installed over the next 6-12 months.



Renewable Energy Growth Program 2015

- The 2015 Renewable Energy Growth (REG) Program launched in May 2015 with 25 MW of capacity available for renewable projects
 - Solar, wind, anaerobic digestion & small hydro
- Program is required to allocate a minimum of 3 MW of capacity to the small solar (1-25 KW) market each year
- Approximately 75% of MW capacity was awarded to solar
- National Grid files the awarded project system sizes and locations to the RI Public Utility Commission quarterly
- As of December 1, 14.3 MW was awarded to medium, commercial and large solar projects
 - Additional 4.95 MW was awarded to wind projects



Renewable Energy Growth Program 2016

- 2016 REG Program Recommendations were approved by the Distributed Generation Board in October 2015
- 40 MW will be available for renewable energy projects and approximately 75% will be awarded to solar projects
- The 2016 REG Program is currently being reviewed by the PUC and a decision is expected by February 15th
- The 2016 REG Program is scheduled to launch in April



Renewable Energy Fund

- As of December 3, 2015, there have been:
 - Residential
 - 285 net-metered projects awarded for a total capacity of 1,895.755 kW
 - -Commercial
 - 36 net-metered projects awarded for a total capacity of 3,372.833 kW

Solarize RI

- North Smithfield Fall 2014 saw 84 contracts signed for 624kW.
- Tiverton/Little Compton

 Spring 2015 saw 67
 contracts signed for 485kW.
- Fall 2015 program is in seven Communities, program ends February 2016





RI Infrastructure Bank (RIIB)

- Established by Governor & General Assembly in July 2015
- RIIB and OER created a new program the Efficient Buildings Fund – to help municipalities finance renewable energy and deep energy efficiency projects.
- RIIB will also offer Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) for both the residential and commercial energy market, including renewable installations.
 - C-PACE anticipated in early 2016.
 - R-PACE anticipated in late spring/early summer 2016.



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
