## **Update on Current Policies**



## Summary of Current Policies / Progress

- DEEP Procurements
  - 4.98 MW of solar likely to come online in Dec 2020 from DEEP Small Scale
     Procurement
- Shared Clean Energy Facility Pilot (SCEF Pilot)
  - 3.6 MW likely to come online in 2020
  - Year 1 of SCEF Procurement is underway.
- Residential Solar Investment Program (RSIP)
  - The RSIP program was extended to April 2021.
  - The program cap was increased to 382MW
  - The program has currently approved 305.28 MW<sub>AC</sub>
- LREC/ZREC Program
  - Years 9 and 10 RFP was approved by PURA on December 2, 2019.
  - Years 9 Small ZREC is expected to begin in Q1, 2021.
  - Bid selection is ongoing in PURA Docket 19-06-36.



#### **DEEP Procurements**

Current ongoing solar project will likely come online in 2020

 13.5 MW of DG wind projects below 5MW were also selected in this procurement (5 MW in MA, 5 MW in VT, and 3.5 MW in CT)



## **SCEF Pilot Update**

 Below are the approved SCEF pilot projects, including size, location, and estimated in service dates:

#### SCEF Year 1 Procurement

- PURA released its final decision on the SCEF Program in Docket No. 19-07-01 on 12/18/2019
- Year 1 SCEF Procurement process is ongoing
  - PURA has asked Eversource and United Illuminating to reevaluate certain information that had originally led to the disqualification of multiple bids.
  - Final selection will be based off the outcome of the ongoing reevaluation
  - Bids were originally due on July 13, 2020, due date was extended to July 27, 2020 due to COVID 19 Pandemic
  - 30 qualified bids were received for YR1
  - The Program is expected to reach its YR1 capacity of 25MW
- PURA Docket No. 19-07-01RE01 is ongoing to determine subscription process for SCEF program



#### Current RSIP

- The current RSIP and Solar Home Renewable Energy Credit (SHREC) program has been extended through April 2021 with an increased cap of 382MW due to the COVID-19 pandemic
  - As of November 27, 2020 the Connecticut Green Bank (CGB) approved  $305.28\,\text{MW}_{\text{AC}}$

<sup>\*28.71</sup>MW<sub>AC</sub> were approved in 2020 but have not yet come online.

 Similar capacity (~60MW) is expected for 2021 and 2022 while the industry transitions to new tariff structure being discussed in PURA Docket No. 17-12-03RE09 and 20-07-01



## Current LREC/ZREC Program

- Auctions for Medium and Large ZREC systems occur at the same time; Year 9 and 10 RFP schedules were submitted August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and approved December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019 in Docket No. 19-06-36
  - Year 9 RFP results will likely be available in Q1 of 2021.

- The final procurement for Medium and Large ZREC, Year 10 is expected to begin in 2021.
- Year 9 for Small ZREC is expected to begin in Q1 of 2021.
  - Year 7 and 8 Small ZREC solicitation is still ongoing.
    - Year 9 Small ZREC will begin January 4, 2021



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# Update on Forward-Looking Policies



## Summary of Forward-Looking Policies

- Current policies in the future
  - RSIP has been extended to April 2021
  - LREC/ZREC YR9 procurement is ongoing
  - LREC/ZREC Med and Large YR10 and Small ZREC YR9 procurements are expected to begin in 2021.
- Program design and implementation for the net metering, RSIP, and LREC/ZREC successor tariff is occurring in 20-07-01.



## Details on Forward-Looking Policies

- Shared Clean Energy Facility (SCEF) Statewide Program
  - USS Shelton from SCEF Pilot program came online in September, 2019.
  - Riverside Thompson SCEF is expected to come online in December, 2020.
  - The Year 1 SCEF Procurement Process is ongoing.
  - 25 MW / year cap for six years (150 MW total)
  - PURA Released its final decision in Dkt. No. 19-07-01 on December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019.
- RSIP + Net Metering Successor
  - Two tariff offerings at expiration of the RSIP: "Buy-All" and a netting tariff with a daily or sub-daily netting interval chosen by PURA
  - Currently being discussed in Dkt. No 17-12-03RE09 and 20-07-01.
  - Uncapped MW / year
  - Reasonable to expect current rate (~60MW) of incremental capacity will continue
- LREC/ZREC Program + Net Metering Successor
  - Currently being discussed in Dkt. No. 20-07-01.
  - Same two tariff structures as RSIP successor;
  - Competitive auctions to set rates; first solicitation year 2020
     50 MW / year cap for six years (300 MW total)
